Today's Game: The Baysox try to avoid the sweep at the hands of the Altoona Curve with Game Three of the Western Division Championship Series on Saturday night at Peoples Natural Gas Field in Altoona... The Curve took the lead for good with a three-run fifth en route to an 8-4 win in Friday's game two... Elvis Escobar delivered the go-ahead RBI double in the frame and Michael Suchy came through with an RBI double of his own... OF Cedric Mullins (3-4, 2B, HR, RBI, 2 R) came up just a triple shy of the cycle for the Baysox, while Garabaz Rosa hit a two-run homer and LHP Tim Berry (1.2 IP, BB, 2 K) had a scoreless outing in relief...

Starting Pitchers: RHP Lucas Long received a no-decision in game one on Sunday at Richmond after allowing four runs on four hits to go along with two walks and four strikeouts in 5.2 IP... 1-1, 2.25 (24.0/6) in 4 GS vs. Altoona... 8/24 @ ALT: L, 7.0 IP, 6 H, 2 R, 2 ER, 3 BB, 3 K... 6-4, 3.56 in 14 GS and 3-2, 1.90, 5 SV in 17 G as a reliever... Has held rightsies to a .188 AVG... The Minneapolis, Minn., native spent the majority of 2016 with High-A Frederick (7-7, 4.27 in 24 GS), but also made 3 GS with Low-A Delmarva (0-0, 0.50 in 3 GS)... Originally selected by BAL in the 24th round of the 2014 draft out of University of San Diego...

RHP Austin Coley has not allowed an earned run in his last 15.0 IP (3 G, 2 GS)... Earned the win on Sunday vs. Harrisburg when he gave up five hits while walking one and fanning two in his seven shutout innings... 0-0, 1.86 (19.1/4) in 4 G (3 GS) vs. Bowie... 7/14 vs. BOW: n/d, 6.0 IP, 7 H, 2 R, 2 ER, BB, 2 K... 5-4, 3.25 in 23 GS and 1-0, 0.68 (13.1/1) in 6 G as a reliever... The Murfreesboro, Tenn., native spent all of 2016 with High-A Bradenton (12-10, 4.65 in 26 G, 25 GS)... Ranked tied for second in Florida State League in wins (12) and fourth in IP (139.1)... In 2015, led the Pirates system and the South Atlantic League (A) in wins (16)... Selected by PIT in the 8th round of the 2014 draft out of Belmont University, became the second highest draft selection in Belmont history behind RHP Blake Owen (Orioles-6th round, 2005)... Selected by NYM in the 27th round of 2013, but did not sign...

Playoff History: This is the seventh postseason appearance in franchise history for the Baysox and their second in the last three seasons... Bowie captured their first ever Eastern League Championship in 2015 after falling to Akron in five games in the first round in 2012... Bowie is 0-4 all-time as a #2 seed...

All Hail Mountcastle: INF Ryan Mountcastle has hit safely in 11 of his last 14 games and is hitting .263-2-5 (15-57, 4 2B, 8 R)... Tied his career-high with four RBI on 8/29 vs. Trenton... Led all of MiLB and MLB in 2B (46)...

Go DJ, That's My DJ: OF DJ Stewart hit safely in 23 of his last 33 G (13 multi-hit G) in the regular season... Hit .317-9-27 (38-120, 11 2B, 21 R, 4 SB) in that span... **Stole his 20th base of the season in game two on Sunday at Richmond and became the first player in franchise history with 20 homers and 20 steals in the same season...** Notched his second multi-homer game of the season on Saturday at Richmond... Stewart and Aderlin Rodriguez are the first set of Baysox teammates to each hit 20 HR in a season since Brandon Waring and Caleb Joseph in 2013...

French Fry: LHP Paul Fry is unscored upon in seven of his first eight G with Bowie and has struck out 21 in that span (13.2 IP)... Has gone multiple innings in five of his eight G...

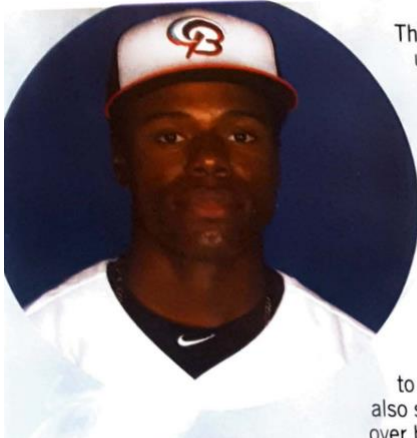
All Aboard the Hess Express: RHP David Hess was dealt the tough-luck loss in game one on Wednesday vs. Altoona after allowing two runs on seven hits to go along with three walks and five strikeouts in 6.1 IP... Dating back to the regular season, Hess has allowed 3 ER or less in 11 of his last 12 GS... Posted a 2.25 ERA over six starts in August...

Eastern League Leaderboard: INF/OF Garabaz Rosa led the league in hits (162), AVG (.310) and RBI (91), ranked second in TB (232) and tied for second in runs scored (75)... OF DJ Stewart led the league in runs scored (80), finished fourth in RBI (79), OBP (.378) and BB (65), ranked fifth in TB (220)... 1B Aderlin Rodriguez ranked third in TB (228) and fifth in RBI (76) and hits (135)... C Austin Wynns ranked fifth in OBP (.381)... RHP Lucas Long finished third in ERA (2.95) and tied for third in CG (2)... LHP John Means finished second in SO (124)... RHP David Hess ranked second in IP (154.1), sat tied for third in wins (11) and third in SO (123), tied for third in OBA (.235)... RHP Yefry Ramirez led the EL in wins (15) and tied for the league lead in CG (3), ranked second in OBA (.232)...

Berry, Berry Good: Dating back to the regular season, LHP Tim Berry is unscored upon in each of his last seven G (7.2 IP) and has notched 12 strikeouts in that span... Fanned a pair over 1.2 shutout IP in game two on Friday vs. Altoona...

Baysox outfielder Cedric Mullins was selected by the Orioles in the 13th round of the 2015 draft out of Campbell University in North Carolina. The 22-year-old Georgia native entered 2017 as the No. 26 prospect in the Orioles organization according to Baseball America,

The 5-foot-8 switch-hitter utilizes tremendous speed, deceptive power, and natural baseball instincts to rattle opposing pitchers. High expectations from the Orioles coaching staff helped Mullins earn a starting role with the Baysox and he responded to the challenge with a 10-game hitting streak to open the season. Mullins also slugged four home runs over his first 12 games and sent shockwaves through the organization with a thunderous leadoff home run in a snowy opening night victory at Akron. "That was a very slow moment. When I hit it, I was just like 'Wow,'" said Mullins. "It was freezing cold out. I got good barrel on it. It still stung a little bit... But to be able to put one

season and admits that there is a deeper significance regarding all of his hard work and dedication to the sport.

"I have my family back at home... and I want to be the guy that they can look up to," said Mullins. "I have a younger brother and a younger sister... Me being the oldest – that's all I've ever done my whole life – was to try to be that example. Them seeing me continue to push, continue to work hard, play hard... I want them to never give up on the dreams that they're pursuing."

Mullins has the requisite skills and the proper mentality to continue his swift rise through the Orioles system. His future looks bright and someday soon he may patrol the outfield at Camden Yards as he keeps building on a fantastic start to his young baseball career.

but Bowie's speedy leadoff hitter is on the rise after being named the Eastern League Player of the Week for the opening week of the season.

"It definitely shows you're going in the right direction," Mullins said. "I was named the [South Atlantic League] Player of the Week the very last week of last year and to be able to continue the same approach, even through Spring Training, and being able to continue having success through the first full week, it definitely means I can play at this level. It's just a matter of being consistent."

Last year, Mullins led the Class-A Delmarva Shorebirds in games played (124), at-bats (517), runs scored (79), hits (141), doubles (37), triples (10), total bases (240), and stolen bases (30). He also tied for the second-most stolen bases in the Orioles organization. This season, Mullins was promoted directly to Double-A Bowie and skipped Advanced-A Frederick altogether.

out of the yard in my first at bat, I was like 'We might have a solid season ahead of us.'"

Mullins accumulated 22 hits, 17 runs scored, and 11 RBI through his first 14 contests and he appears poised to develop into a premiere leadoff hitter and multi-tool threat.

"Being able to work the count in your favor is a huge part... and over these past few years I've been able to slowly learn how to win counts. That's what's led to my hitting being as effective as it is."
